Introduction: Sadducees, like most Jews around Jesus' time, did not believe in the resurrection of the dead. Many Pharisees, in contrast, did believe in it, as, of course, did Jesus and his followers. But the Sadducees would not give in easily.

First Reading 2 Maccabees 7:1-2. 9-14

In this book, new ground is broken in that people are prepared to die rather than submit to pagan worship, because they believe that the virtuous rise to new life, which will never end.

Second Reading 2 Thessalonians 2:16 – 3:5

Paul reminds his readers that God is faithful and will guard them and keep them safe even if difficulties exist.

Gospel Luke 20:27-38

Sadducees did not believe that the dead rise; many Pharisees did believe in the resurrection. It is strange to learn that Pharisees could actually agree with Jesus on occasion.
