<u>Church Collection</u> Owing to a change of rules, from 6 April banking fees, which used to be paid from our Diocesan Levy, will have to be paid by each parish directly to the bank. (Currently the monthly levy for St Andrew's is £814.00 and St Mary's £58.59). In addition to payments from our accounts we will be charged for each deposit into our accounts. Coins and cash in general will be the most expensive. This is an opportunity for you to consider helping to maintain the parish in ways other than cash, for example by using the card machine (at St Andrew's) or a monthly standing order. The parish account details can be provided on request.

This is also an opportunity to review how much you contribute to the collection. 'To help to provide for the material needs of the Church, each according to his own ability' is one of the precepts of the Church. As a guide, several years ago, Cardinal Basil Hume suggested that every Catholic should offer one hour's pay each week. Some give as little as £1 a week. Clearly the parish cannot survive long term on this.
